Now beginning his 13<sup>th</sup> season with the symphony, Mark has raised the level of artistry of this talented volunteer orchestra to become a treasured jewel of the Tampa Bay community, producing professional level performances for the listening pleasure of their audiences. Mark established the International Composition Competition with the Tampa Bay Symphony to promote 21<sup>st</sup> century works by composers around the world. He continues to promote classical music for young musicians by mentoring winning contestants as they participate in the symphony's Jack Heller Young Artist Competition. For audiences, Mark's creative and charismatic demonstrations of the music being performed educate and entertain those who are new to classical music as well as those who have loved it for years.

Maestro Sforzini is an award-winning musician and well known in the arts community of Tampa Bay. Among his numerous credits, he is the General Director of the St. Petersburg Opera and an established composer. He was the principal bassoon of The Florida Orchestra for 15 seasons. He was also the conductor of the Pinellas Youth Symphony from 1999-2002.
